Forty-one Ugandan coaches enrolled for a specialized coaching course at the FUFA Technical Centre, Njeru with the aim of improving the goalkeeping department. The Six day advanced course targeted participants from the Uganda Premier league clubs, 2nd division, women clubs and other interested participants. The participants were trained by goalkeeping expert Frank Petersen from Denmark.

'Goalkeeping is one of the specialized areas of football and our analysis shows little efforts have been made towards this area with the last FIFA Course in Uganda conducted in July 2016. It is an area of priority this year within our activities and we are pleased that the FUFA Executive Committee gave a green light to this course'

UTB injects UGX 200M in FUFA

The magnetic and appealing brand of football in Uganda continues to grow and attract attention among Ugandans.

BUL wins FUFA Juniors League Title

BUL FC Junior Team were crowned the 2018/2019 FUFA Juniors League (U19) champions after defeating KCCA FC Soccer Academy 3-0 in the final played at the FUFA Technical Centre in Njeru in June.

Reagan Kalyowa scored a brace in the 22nd and 48th minutes before Deo Sentongo added the third goal in the 62nd minute to hand BUL FC JT their first ever FUFA Juniors League title.

Fancied KCCA FC SA, with this season's tournament top scorer (31 goals) for the past three seasons in Sادات Anaku, missed out on the winner's medal again for the third time.

They fell to Vipers SC JT in 2015/2016 and to Soana FC JT in 2016/2011 all in the post-match penalties.



Anaku is the all-time FUFA Juniors League top scorer with 84 goals, - (2016/17 -27 goals, 2017/18 - 26 goals and 2018/19 – 31goals).

In this year's final BUL FC JT enjoying a partisan crowd, dominated both halves producing the best chances in the match that was watched by a sizeable crowd.

Oketch joins Sekyanzi Faizo who won the accolade in 2015, KCCA FC's Allan Okello in 2015/2016, Ivan Asaba (2016/ 2017) and Vipers SC JT Moses Bakkabulindi in 2017/2018 season.

BUL FC JT goalkeeper Bewayo Isaac was named the best goalkeeper. He conceded only 13 goals in 22 outings.

KCCA FC SA finished top of Treble Group with 67 points while eventual champions BUL FC JT ended at the top of Hat-Trick Group with 56 points.

FIFA WORLD CUP 2026

FUFA turns focus on Project 2026 World Cup

After the completion of 'Project Cameroon 2019', FUFA has now turned its focus on the 2026 FIFA World Cup to be hosted by Canada, Mexico and USA.

Project Cameroon 2019 was the effort to ensure the national senior soccer team qualified for the 2019 AFCON Finals that was originally supposed to be hosted in Cameroon. The project was launched on November 24, 2014 at FUFA House in Mengo.

The tournament was moved to Egypt after Cameroon failed to convince the organisers that the country would be ready in time to host Africa's biggest soccer showpiece.

But as Uganda exited the tournament at the round of 16 stage, the local soccer federation has now shifted guns towards the 2026 FIFA World Cup.

Addressing a press conference at FUFA House in Mengo on July 10, FUFA President Eng. Moses Magogo said they had achieved their set targets for the national team and they now had to set another yardstick.

Uganda had qualified for the 2017 AFCON Finals in Gabon and they made it back to back when they made it to the Finals in Egypt. Magogo insisted that despite the Gabon feat, the set target remained qualification for AFCON 2019 which was eventually achieved.

Eng. Magogo in a special way appreciated the different stakeholders who have worked as a unit to help achieve the set targets collectively.

In particular, he lauded the President of the Republic of Uganda HE Yoweri Kaguta Museveni, First Lady, who is also Minister for Education and Sports Janet Museveni, the Government, FUFA Executive, FUFA Delegates, soccer clubs, sponsors and partners, FUFA administration, the media and the fans for the financial and moral support to the Uganda Cranes.

Like in 2015, FUFA will hold a stakeholders' symposium to brainstorm on how to reach the set targets.

FUFA President, Eng. Moses Magogo

Today marks the end of the Project Cameroon 2019 that we launched on 24th November 2014. It has been a realistic project with many positives and definitely crucial learning experiences. We are now launching the FIFA World Cup 2026 Project," Magogo announced.

"We shall however remain competing in the qualifiers for all the junior and senior team competitions in between as we prepare the team for the set goal.

To be more specific, we are looking at CHAN 2020, 2022, 2024 and 2026, AFCON 2021, 2023 and 2025

Led by former Uganda Cranes and Express FC striker Hassan Mubiru, Katwe put the first leg 2-1 loss at St Mary's Stadium, Kitende at the back of their mind and came out with guns blazing for the second leg at the StarTimes Stadium, Lugogo.

Alex Katumba, Allan Bukenya (penalty) and Denis Lwetutte's goals gave Katwe a 3-1 victory on the evening and a 4-3 aggregate overall. Katwe will be joined by three new other entrants New Villa FC (Kitara Region), Myda FC (Eastern Region) and Saviors FC (Northern Region).

The new kids on the block in Uganda's second most tier league faced off with teams over two legs in the playoffs from the regions of Buganda, Western, West Nile and North East.

Three teams get promotion from the FUFA Big League to the top flight every season. Proline FC, Wakiso Giants and Kyetume FC were promoted to the Uganda Premier League 2019/2020 season.

Finance

Clubs, match officials dues cleared

FUFA, through the Finance Department cleared all payments in prize money and allowances for all the 16 clubs and referees who featured in the 2018/19 StarTimes Uganda Premier League season. FUFA has made payment of 128M to all the clubs that played in the 2018/19 season.

There were 240 matches last season in the top league, for which FUFA appoints five officials for per outing with each entitled to a UGX 150,000 allowance.

‘We have settled payments of all prize monies for the 16 clubs that featured in the Uganda Premier League last season. The Champions KCCA FC got UGX 60M. We believe this will help the clubs during the off-season as they plan for the forthcoming coming season’ said **FUFA’s finance director Decalas Kiiza**

Close to 120 match officials were also settled. We have paid UGX 180M to referees, match commissioners and assessors for the entire 2018/19 season. However, the first round monies had been paid last year’ said **Ronnie Kalema, Chairman of Uganda Football Referees Association**

As a result of Desabre's departure and the conclusion of the AFCON 2019 campaign, FUFA put aside the entire national teams' technical staff and has advertised the respective positions for new applicants.

In the meantime, Abdalla Mubiru will be in charge of the Cranes side which is currently involved in CHAN qualification campaign assisted by Livingstone Mbabazi.

Northern Region districts of Gulu and Lira have been chosen to host the next phase of the FUFA Drum 2019 from the Quarterfinals to the Final of the tournament in October.

The latest development was announced by the Chairman of the FUFA Drum Organising Committee Rogers Byamukama.

'Like we communicated at start of this year's edition, the format of the FUFA Drum after the group stages was changed. We have selected Gulu and Lira to host the quarterfinals. The two districts have been chosen to ease accessibility of the fans and the media during the tournament' said Byamukama

He added that the federation is working so hard to make sure the host venues meet the required standards. Lira has already identified Akii Bua Stadium for the matches but the venue will be subject to inspection.

Museveni rewards Cranes

The President of the Republic of Uganda Yoweri Kaguta Museveni gave One Million Dollar (USD 1M) to the entire 42 man contingent to AFCON 2019 to share as reward for their performance at the tournament.

Uganda was knocked out by Senegal 1-0 in the round of 16-the first time the Cranes had reached this far since 1978.

The President met the players at Statehouse Entebbe on the very day (Monday 7th July 2019) the team returned home

'I'm very happy the Uganda Cranes went up to the last 16. I know we will perform better next time. I will organize 1m dollars with the government to distribute it among the players and officials. Of course, the officials will not get as much as the players. Although We Didn't Win All Our Fixtures, We Made A Good Effort And Achieved Some Reasonable Success. I Don't Know How Senegal Got That Goal. I See Our Players Are All Fit Young People. All They Need Is More Stamina. I Thank The Team Once Again' said Museveni.

Magogo entrenched on CAF high table

As the AFCON 2019 finals climaxed in Egypt last month with Algeria running away with the trophy, the Ugandan football fraternity had a lot to jubilate about when FUFA President Eng. Moses Magogo was elected as full member to the Confederation of Africa Football (CAF) Executive Committee.

Eng. Magogo beat his challenger, veteran Leo-

degar Tenga from Tanzania, 33 to 19 votes in a poll conducted during the 41st CAF Ordinary Assembly at Marriot Zamalek Hotel in Cairo. Magogo will represent the Eastern and

Central Africa Zone (CECAFA) on the CAF decision making body he has been serving as a co-opted member.



‘It was my dream 20 years ago that one day I would serve as a CAF Executive Committee member,’ Magogo said on his return from Egypt. ‘I am so happy that I have achieved it now. ‘It is a big honour to be voted on the CAF Executive and I thank my Executive Committee at FUFA, the delegates and the team that campaigned for me. This is not a personal victory but victory for us all. ‘As young leaders on the continent, we need to come up with the best ideas to help

elevate Africa like other Confederations. I thank the Almighty Allah and those who voted for me and the rest of Africa,’ Magogo concluded.

Other elected members included Abdulhakim Abrahim Abdulrazzik Al Shalmani from Libya and Mauritius’ Mohamad Ally Samir Sobha.

Tooro from Kabarole also needed penalties to see off Little Treasure of Kiryandongo. The two schools

played to a 1-1 draw in the final before Tooro won 4-1 on penalties to lift the Kitara Regional trophy.

The Eastern region title was won by Busumbu PS from Manafwa after beating Main Street Primary School (Jinja). Busumbu won 4-2 on penalties after the two tied 1-1 in normal time.
