**RE: PROPOSAL OF CANDIDATES FOR THE OFFICE OF THE FUFA PRESIDENT**

In reference to Article 28 (2) of the FUFA Statutes, on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> February 2025, FUFA published the notice in the Daily Monitor Newspaper and the Observer Newspaper that the FUFA Elective General Assembly is scheduled for 5<sup>th</sup> July 2025 in Hoima (See attachment).

## UPL: How coach Wasswa Bbosa revived Kitara FC

Coach Wasswa Bbosa and his backroom staff at Kitara FC will be commemorating a milestone this weekend. The visit of URA FC to Hoima's Royals Park in Butema, home of Kitara FC, will mark as a reversal of what was Bbosa's first game in-charge of the club.

This was back in November 2024 at Nakivubo stadium, where Bbosa and his charges lost 0-2 to the taxmen. It was not the start Bbosa hoped he would have on match-day seven then, as the team lounged in the relegation zone, on the back of just one win, a draw and four losses.

However, since Bbosa's appointment, he has overseen 11 league games. Although his first two ended in defeat without scoring a goal, this has been followed by a run where his side has won seven and drawn two league games. This has left many mystified about the Kitara magic. "No, it is not magic. It is just work on the training ground. Once I arrived at Kitara, I recognized one fact. My predecessor had assembled a very good squad, probably the best in the league. All I did was to restore belief and sell my ideas of work, work, work, as the only solution for us to emerge from the deep hole we were in," Bbosa said.

For many years of his coaching career, Bbosa has banked on his strong personality and self-belief. He has never let his lack of English language command

put him down. In his Luganda, he duly passes on his message, and wherever he has been, players have responded to him. This is largely attributed to his approach of simplicity is golden.

Bbosa is quite orthodox in style, and will always play players to their strengths. In fact, many believe that had it not been for the fact that today, the 4-3-3 system is largely the default: setting of football globally, Bbosa would still be playing a 4-4-2, which he still veers to on numerous

occasions. But at the same time, Bbosa is a task master, as his training sessions are quite intense with physical drills. That has been his mantra since joining Kitara.

After the first two games in-charge, last November, there was an international break of two weeks which, according to Bbosa, provided him a protracted period on the training ground to improve them tactically and physically. Actually the likes of Dennis Omede and Jude Ssemugabi, who had been

away with The Granes, sat out the subsequent games because they had to catch up with the rest.

Kitara's first game back was a 4-0 whitewash of UPDF FC, followed by an impressive defensive display against Vipers SC in Kitende, which ended goalless. Kitara has scored 24 goals in nine league games, placing them as the top scoring team in the division with 30 goals after 17 games. Add the two Uganda Cup games, in which Kitara scored six goals and conceded only once, no team has scored as many goals as Kitara since November 2024.

During Brian Ssenyondo's six games in-charge this season, Kitara scored six goals and conceded nine. Since then, Kitara have conceded only three, the last one coming on November 8 at Kavumba against Sottilo Bright Stars. But, Bbosa has already had his revenge on Sottilo, following his team's 2-0 win over them a week ago. With nine successive clean sheets, Kitara is showing championship form, although it may be a little too late since they are 15 points behind the league leaders Vipers.

Although catching Vipers seems unlikely, Bbosa pointed out that re-organizing Kitara's defending was high on the agenda when he arrived. That has been the foundation for the team's form, winning all five home games thus far.

## Surveyors hold inaugural sports gala

The Institute of Surveyors of Uganda (ISU) held its inaugural sports gala last weekend at Hamz stadium, Nakivubo. The gala attracted 16 professional associations under the theme "Stop Violence Against Surveyors."

The event, sponsored by Stanbic Bank Uganda Limited, aimed to foster camaraderie and raise awareness about the challenges faced by surveyors in the field.

Rev. Canon Dr Duncans Mugumya, the commissioner

for Sports and Physical Education, represented the state minister of Sports, Peter Ogwang, and emphasized the importance of engaging in sports for health and well-being. "This initiative aligns with the ministry's holistic approach to learning, advocating for involvement in co-curricular activities beyond the traditional classroom and office environments," he stated. The tournament concluded with the Land Surveyors & Mappers department of the ministry of Lands, Housing and Urban Development emerging

victorious, defeating the Public Infrastructure department of the ministry of Works 5-3 in a tense penalty shootout.

Individual accolades were awarded to Godfrey Toko from the department of Survey and Mapping for Best Goalkeeper, Edrine Kagaba from the Uganda Society of Architects for Top Scorer, and Flanny Arop from the Institute of Survey and Land Management-Entebbe as the Most Valuable Player (MVP).

Participants included various chapters such as Quantity Surveying, Mining and Hydrological Surveying, Valuation Surveying, and representatives from institutions like Makerere University, Kyambogo University and Mengo SS.

Surveyors in Uganda have faced violent attacks while on duty, often resulting in injuries or fatalities.

Notably, recent incidents have included the arson of a car owned by land surveyors in Luwero district, and in 2022, mining surveyors in Karamoja reported being

attacked. Attacks have been linked to tensions with local communities, particularly in areas where residents have been evicted from land.
